





Supported living in Northampton

A highly specialised newly developed large detached residential home, providing specialist care and education for four people aged between 16 -25, with high acuity needs; complex autism, learning disabilities and behaviours that may challenge others.

Located close to the small market town of Rothwell, Shotwell Mill offers room for four people and comprises of one ground floor bedroom with ensuite and three further three bedrooms on the first floor, two with ensuite and one bedroom with use of a separate bathroom.

This beautifully decorated home is light and airy and provides plenty of space for socialising, relaxing or regulating contact with others in a range of communal spaces; the kitchen, dining room, living room, conservatory, an additional activity/sensory room on the first floor and large garden with plenty of space for activities and events.

About this service

For individuals with a diagnosis of ASD and behaviours which may challenge others Shotwell Mill Lane focuses on offering highly specialised care, support and education for young people that fall between the ages of 16 to 25.

The highly skilled team excel in supporting people with very complex needs to lead fulfilling and active lives underpinned by a strong focus on in-house specialist positive behaviour support and a unique communications programme.

The specialised training for our team is bespoke to each person being supported so that we achieve maximum personalisation, with team members involved in the assessment and transitions process where possible.

Life at the service

Shotwell Mill, situated close to the small market town of Rothwell, provides opportunities for people integrate themselves, as much as possible into their community gaining daily living skills locally and in the nearby larger town of Kettering in shopping and travel with everything being on the doorstep. It also provides good transport access via our dedicated vehicle or public transport, with plenty of space for parking.

Each person supported has their own individualised visual communication system, that presents and communicates visually in the way best suited to them, in a logical, structured, sequential form.

This home might best suit young people of transitional age who require a high level of specialist support during the day and night, aged between 16-25, male or female seeking specialist care and education. This home would be ideal for those transitioning into adulthood from family homes, colleges and or moving under the transforming care programme.
